
Dear Parents,

We have been using Class Charts as a school now for four weeks and after a couple of teething errors, I hope you can now fully engage with the information shared with you.

I would like to take this opportunity to explain a little more about how we use Class Charts at KACP, as it may differ slightly from your experience if you have a child in secondary school.

As a school, we understand that communication often occurs when something goes wrong. However, we recognise the importance of celebrating successes as well. This is why we have made a deliberate decision to share only positive behaviours with you. You should be receiving notifications when your child demonstrates one of our school values, follows our behaviour curriculum, or embraces the KACP Way. We also celebrate weekly achievements on Class Charts, such as

Reader of the Week, Value Champion, and Rocket Readers.



The graph on the left displays how many positive behaviour points your child has received and then a ratio. The ratio compares the number of positive points to other behaviours on Class Charts. These could be positive behaviours that do not have a point assigned, for example a note home, or certificate. In some cases these behaviours may be negative.

While we do track poor behaviour choices through Class Charts, this information is used internally for monitoring purposes and to help us identify areas for improvement. If your child makes inappropriate choices, their class teacher may address the matter, or for more serious incidents, a member of the leadership team may get involved. Should a pattern of negative behaviour arise, the school will reach out to you to discuss the situation and explore any support that may be needed.

If you have any concerns or questions about your child's behaviour, you are welcome to discuss them with their class teacher at any time throughout the year, or during our parents' evenings.

For those of you who have not yet signed up for Class Charts, invitation emails will be sent out again on Monday.

Our updated behaviour policy will also be available soon on our website.
