Annual Nasal Flu Vaccination

Your child is eligible to have the annual nasal flu vaccination, this is offered to all children and young people in Reception to Year 11.

Flu vaccination is important as it helps protect children and other vulnerable family members against flu, which can be a serious or life-threatening illness.

If you **DO** or **DO NOT** want your child to have the flu vaccination, please fill out the online consent form using the link below or QR code.

****Anyone who fills in an online form (for yes or no) has a chance of winning a £50 shopping voucher****

Please complete the consent form **at least 3 working days before the session** to ensure your child will be vaccinated at the school session. If you submit the consent form after this time your child may be unable to receive the vaccination in school but will be offered a clinic appointment.

*There will be the option to have the nasal spray or injection. The nasal spray is the universal option and most effective way to receive the vaccine. The injection is **only** available for children where the nasal spray is not medically suitable or for religious/cultural grounds due to porcine gelatine content.*

If your child is eligible for the injection and in year 3 – 11, this will be administered in school. However, if your child is in year R, 1 & 2, you will be invited to attend a community clinic for the injection.

Important information, please read:

- Please ensure you inform the school and the School Aged Immunisation Service if there are any changes in your child's Asthma i.e. have been experiencing active wheezing or increased use of their inhalers in the 72 hours before their vaccination.
- If your child receives their flu vaccination elsewhere after completing the consent form you must inform the School Aged Immunisation Service via phone before the date of the school session.
- If at any time you wish to change your consent, you will be required to inform your child's school and the School Aged Immunisation Service via phone before the date of the school session.

FAQ's

Q: Where can I find more information about the flu vaccine?

Q: What are the ingredients in the vaccine?

A: We use the Fluenz nasal vaccine and a list of the ingredients can be found in the patient information leaflet here [FLUENZ Tetra, INN-influenza vaccine \(live attenuated, nasal\) \(medicines.org.uk\)](#)

Q: What does long term health condition mean?

A: Examples include:

- Asthma
- Diabetes
- Heart condition
- Arthritis / rheumatological conditions
- Epilepsy
- Cancer

Q: What treatment would affect someone's immune system?

A: Conditions or immunosuppressive therapy such as:

- acute and chronic leukaemia's
- lymphoma
- HIV infection not on highly active antiretroviral therapy (HAART)
- cellular immune deficiencies
- high dose corticosteroids.

Q: What do we mean by Intensive Care (ICU)?

A: Please only answer 'yes' to this question if your child was admitted to a specialist intensive care unit such as PICU, please do not include admission to general paediatric wards or children's assessment unit (CAU).

Q: What does anaphylaxis mean?

A: Severe allergic reaction requiring intensive care (PICU) admission

Q: What does salicylate therapy mean?

A: Taking medication such as Aspirin

Q: What is antiviral therapy?

A: Antiviral drugs act by killing or preventing the growth of viruses such as Oseltamivir (Tamiflu) and Zanamivir (Relenza)

Q: What is an unrepaired craniofacial malformation?

A: Conditions such as:

- Cleft palate
- Cleft lip
- Craniosynostosis

Q: My child has additional needs, how can you support them?

A: We often work with children who have additional needs and are happy to offer more support, time and encouragement for them.
